ATTENDANCE

- 1. It shall be the duty of each student to attend the College regularly and punctually on all working days. No student shall absent herself / himself from the college without applying for leave.
- 2. A student who absents herself / himself shall submit an application in the prescribed form to their Class incharge. In case of sudden illness, the application shall be submitted in person to the Class incharge along with a medical certificate as early as possible. All leave applications with the remarks of the Class incharge shall then be submitted to the Principal for orders.

In each case the reasons for absence shall be specifically mentioned. The Principal reserves the right of calling for a Medical Certificate and of deciding each case on its merits. In cases not covered by the above, leave application shall be submitted as soon as possible after the leave is taken and in any case, before 3.45 p.m. on the first day of absence after the period of absence.

- 3. Granting of leave is entirely at the discretion of the Principal. Non- compliance with rules will entail automatic refusal of leave unless the student explains to the satisfaction of the Class incharge. Her / His Failure to comply with the rules, habitual non-compliance will entail imposition of fine or removal of the student's name from the roll of the College.
- 4. If a student is absent herself / himself for a continuous period of five working days without leave, her
 / his name will be off from the roll. Unless she / he convince satisfactorily that her / his failure to obtain leave was unavoidable.
- 5. The working day is divided into two sessions as forenoon and afternoon sessions. There will be three periods in the forenoon session and two periods in the afternoon.
- 6. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of every period. A student who is not in the class when the attendance is taken shall be marked absent and shall lose attendance for that session. It shall however be open to the teacher to mark a late comer present if he/she is satisfied with the student's explanation. A student who is absent without leave during any one or more periods of a session will be regarded as absent for the whole session.
- 7. The attendance certificate will not be granted unless (i) the Principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct are satisfactory and (ii) the student has attended three fourths of the number of working days in the academic year. Attendance certificates are liable to be held within the case of students who have not attended at least 75 percent of the working days.

- 9. No students shall be permitted to leave the class in the course of the hour. If he / she is needed urgently by the parent or guardian, he / she shall obtain permission from the office and only on receipt of intimation from the office, the student shall be permitted to leave the class.

GENERAL CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

- 1. Every student shall wear a clean and decent dress.
- 2. Every student should wear ID card when they enter the college. Every student shall wish teachers of the college when they meet them for the first time during the day, within the college or outside.
- 3. When the teacher enters or leaves the class room, students shall get up and keep standing, till the teacher takes his/her seat or leaves the room.
- 4. Student shall leave the class room with permission or until the teacher leaves the room.
- 5. Students can spend their leisure class/time in the Library. They shall not loiter in the verandah or in the College campus and disturb the other classes.
- 6. Students shall not make any noise while moving from class to class.
- 7. Students are warned against displacing the furniture of the college. Any damage done will be charged for.
- 8. Student can enter into the college office with permission.
- 9. Students are expected to read the notice on the college notice board. Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as an excuse.
- 10. No notice of any kind shall be circulated among the students or displayed on the notice board without the written sanction of the Principal.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

- 1. Smoking inside the college premises, throwing out waste papers, defacing the walls and committing nuisance on the grounds are punishable offences.
- 2. No student shall take part in organizing any demonstration or strike.
- 3. Students on the rolls of college are forbidden to take an active part in political agitation directed against the authority of the government.
- 4. Principal or other constituted authorities of the College may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary nature. Regulation for the conduct of students on the roll is sought for (a) the observance of the above rules and (b) to maintain the reputation of the College.

- 5. Principal or other constituted authorities of the College shall have the power to impose the following punishments: Fine, with-holding attendance and/or course certificate, suspension or expulsion from the College, cancellation of scholarship and fee concessions.
- 6. Students are not allowed to address any authority in a body.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The general library now contains more than 26,000 books on various subjects. Dailies, magazines and periodicals of good order are available.

Our Library is an invaluable data centre for students and faculty members. It is well-equipped with the automation software "Campus I Lib". The Library has a collection of over 26,300 books on different subjects, 40 reputed National and International Journals, Magazines, News papers, e-resources and back volumes. It consists of recent books and Journals in the field of Arts, Science and Social Sciences etc., in addition to online resources.

The total area of the Library is 3, 328 sq ft. with the seating capacity of about 100 readers. The Library is completely computerized with barcode technology. Barcode laser scanners are used in the circulation counter for book transactions. The staff members and the students are provided with separate ID cards with barcode which ensures easy accessibility and issue of book procedure. Provides Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) service to its users. The library is fitted with CCTV cameras. It provides N-LIST under UGC-INFONET to access E-resources at free of cost.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Library is a "Temple of Learning" hence complete silence, dignity and decorum should be maintained inside the library.
- 2. On all Working days the library will be kept open from 9.00a.m to 4.45pm.
- 3. Personal books and files should be left at the entrance of the library. Plain sheet should be taken instead.
- 4. Students/Staff should scan their ID card in the E-gate register scanner while entering.
- 5. Books will be issued only on the production of ID card.
- 6. No sub-lending of books is permitted.
- 7. Underlining, scribbling, tearing of pages or any other type of mutilation of books, magazines, journals, etc.., mishandling or misuse of computers will lead to severe action and fine.
- 8. Book Issue Procedure:

Teaching Staff	-	10 books
Non-Teaching Staff	-	5 books
UG Students	-	2 books
PG Students	-	3 books
Research Scholars	-	5 books

9. Books will be issued normally for a period of fourteen days. If the book is not returned on the due day, a fine of one rupee per day will be collected.

- 10. Before leaving the counter, the member must check whether the book is in proper condition. If not, immediately report to the librarian. Otherwise he/she is responsible for the replacement of the book.
- 11. The reference books like Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Very expensive books, Journals and Magazines are not issued, they can be referred inside the library.
- 12. Students are expected to use the books with care. If a book is lost or damaged the borrower should replace the books or pay the three times the cost of the book as penalty.
- 13. The Librarian may ask a student to return the library book at any time.
- 14. Transfer certificate and conduct certificate will not be issued to the students if they have not returned the library books.
- 15. Violation of the rules would lead to severe action.
- Note: The above rules are intended to regulate the use of Library resources and will be reviewed periodically to meet the changing needs.

LABORATORY RULES

- 1. Act responsibly and maintain silence.
- 2. Always work under the supervision of the staff or lab assistant.
- 3. Follow all written and verbal instructions carefully.
- 4. Do not bring any eatables inside the lab.
- 5. Wear your safety equipments.
- 6. Know how to use and where to find all safety equipments including the first aid kit, eyewash station, safety shower, fire extinguisher, fire blankets, fire alarm and exits.
- 7. Dispose all waste properly.
- 8. No horseplay will be tolerated.
- 9. Keep a tidy lab.
- 10. Students will he held responsible for missing, damaging and misusing of any lab equipments.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS WORK

- 1. The course of study is based on semester pattern with Internal Assessment under choice based credit system.
- The examinations consist of both the internal (CIA) and the external (end semester) theory exams.
 The theory examinations shall be conducted for three hours at the end of each semester.
- 3. The UG internal assessment will be done through two CIA and one model exam. Out of twenty five marks, it is split up as 5 marks for assignment, 5 marks for attendance and 15 marks for CIA/Model exams.
- 4. 40 marks is the passmark in the semester with minimum of 30 marks out of 75 and 10 marks out of 25.
- 5. The PG internal assessment will be done through two CIA and one model exam. Out of twenty five marks, it is split up as 5 marks for assignment, 5 marks for attendance 5 marks for seminar and 10 marks for CIA/Model exams.

- 6. 50 marks is the passmark in the semester with minimum of 38 marks out of 75 and 12 marks out of 25.
- 7. Students should attend all internal assessment exam and model exam. Two assignments and 75% of attendance are mandatory.
- 8. The students failing in any subject(s) will be permitted to appear for the same in the subsequent semester examinations.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR FORUMS / ACTIVITES

1. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS wing has five units with the sanctioned strength of 500 functioning under the guidance of five programme offers. Any student either in the aided or unaided stream, who has penchant for social service may get enrolled in NSS. Besides regular activities, a seven days special camp focusing on tree plantation, creation of awareness regarding personal hygiene, AIDS, blood donation, Environmental protection etc. is organized every year. The wing pays attention to the all round development of the students.

2. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC Army wing with the sanctioned strength of 52 is under the command of a Commissioned Officer. Both boys and girls students who wish to improve their personality and leadership qualities and aspire to take up various positions in the army may get enrolled in NCC. The cadets may appear for 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations after fulfilling the requirements prescribed by the authorities.

3. Youth Red Cross (YRC)

This is yet another service organization with special focus on service to the society. Both Men and Women students may get enrolled in this forum. Training in Health Care, First Aid, Fire Fighting, Rescue Activities, personality Development are the salient features of YRC. It also lends helping hand in the housekeeping of the institution.

4. **Red Ribbon Club (RRC)**

The Red Ribbon Club in a voluntary on camp intervention program for students. The program organised by RRC address the knowledge, attitude and behaviour of the youths in the interrelated area of voluntary Blood Donation, HIV/AIDS, as demanded by their age, environment and life style.

Moto - "Embarking on the Journey of Life"

5. **Physical Education (with Fitness Centre)**

With the objective of improving the health and fitness of the youth, the fitness centre with many state-of-the art equipments is established for both men and women students. The Centre functions under the supervision of the Director of Physical Education. The students may avail the facilities between 4.00 p.m. and 5.30 p.m.

6. Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The cell provides Guidance and Counseling to the students regarding higher studies and conducts coaching, model tests, group discussions, mock interviews etc. it also arranges for campus interviews for placement in various organizations. Being housed in a separate room, the cell works between 9.00 a.m. and 10.00 a.m. and between 4.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m.

7. Fine Arts Association

This Association intends to create fervour and passion among the students in fine arts. The raw talents in music, painting, drawing, drama, dance etc., are being honed through this club.

8. Student's welfare and counselling centre

With the objective of taking care of both physical and mental health of the students, welfare and counselling centre has been constituted. To be housed in a separate room, the centre is to be manned by five staff members, out of whom two would be women. Students both boys and girls having grievances and emotional problems may feel free to meet the counselors and get counselling.

COLLEGE UNION AND ALLIED ASSOCIATIONS

- 1. All the students of the college and members of the staff shall be honorary members of the college union. The following Associations are affiliated to the Union.

 - 2. English literary and Debating Association
 - 3. History Association
 - 4. Chemistry Association
 - 5. Biology Association
 - 6. Mathematics Association
 - 7. Computer Science Association
 - 8. Commerce Association
 - 9. Games and Sports Association
 - 10. Fine arts Association
- 2. The objectives of the union are as follows
 - a) To provide its members a ground for acquiring habit of effective speaking and skillful debates.
 - b) To further the common life of students which creates opportunities for social and cultural intercourse among its members.
 - c) To plan and execute such programmes as would afford adequate opportunities for the development of special talent and interests of its members.
 - d) To enable students to cultivate qualities of leadership and thereby prepare them for the service of the country.
- 3. The committee of the college union shall consist of:
 - a) Principal as President

- b) Vice-President
- c) Student Chairman (to be elected by all the student members of the Union)
- d) Secretary (to be elected by all the student members of the Union)
- 4. The Principal shall be the Ex-officio President of the College Union and other Associations affiliated to it and she shall be the final authority on all matters pertaining to the union and other Associations. The Vice-President of the Union and other Associations will be nominated by the Principal and the College Council Members.
- 5. Meetings shall be held only with the prior approval of the Principal and the respective Vice-President deputed by her for this purpose.
- 6. No expenditure shall be incurred except with the previous permission of the Principal.
- 7. The Election will be conducted by ballots if necessary and the office bearers should hold office for the academic year. In the event of an office – bearer resigning her/his post, the President shall have the power to nominate a student member to carry on the functions of the office bearer.
- 8. The functions of the Union Cabinet shall be
 - 1. To organize and conduct debates, study circles from time to time.
 - 2. To organise extension lecture, popular exhibition and undertake such other cognate work as would be of educative value to its members and to society.
 - 3. To afford opportunities for students to be trained as speakers, debaters and leaders.
 - 4. To do such other things which might contribute to the social and cultural advancement of the community and enhance its reputation and dignity.
- 9. The Current funds of the Union shall be kept in such a manner as the Principal may direct.
- 10. No information or report about the Union or other associations shall be sent to the press or the broadcasting agencies without the permission and approval of the President.
- 11. For each Association, a student secretary will be elected by all the students of the college.
- 12. The college union and other associations are purely bodies to foster co- curricular activities of the students and will not have anything to do with the day administration of the College nor with party politics.
- 13. The rules that are framed for the college union are applicable to the associations which are affiliated to the College Union. Each association shall have its own Vice-president and Secretary but not a student - chairman.

FEE CONCESSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Students belonging to specified communities are eligible for the grant of Full or Half fee Concessions. The details of which can be known from the college office.

The Concession will be granted wherever permissible. Applications for concessions shall be submitted before the 1st August of every year. Prescribed application forms can be had from the College office.

Grant for scholarships from Government of India or State Government will be admissible to the students only when sanction orders are issued by the appropriate authorities. The college is not responsible

for the grant or non-grants of Government Scholarships. All students are expected to pay their dues in the College in time.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSIONS

- Half fee concession under rule 92 T.N.E.R for Degree Courses is given to backward Community students whose parental income does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/- per annum. They may apply to the Principal for the same.
- Full fee concession under rule 92. T.N.E.R. is available to the students of scheduled Casts / Tribe.
 Most Backward classes and Denitrified Tribes may apply to the Principal for the same.
- 3. Concessions for the Children and dependent of service personnel of the Indian Army, air Force and Indian Navy are available.
- 4. Concessions for the children of political sufferers are also available. In addition to the above concession, the following scholarships are also available for both residential and non residential students.
 - 1. Backward class / Most Backward class welfare scholarship and Adi-Dravidar Welfare scholarship.

BC, MBC, SC & ST students are eligible for the above scholarship.

The Income limit for BC/MBC : Rs. 2,00,000.

The Income limit for SC/ST : Rs. 2,50,000.

2. Kallar – Reclamation scholarship is only for Primalaikallar students. They shall apply to the Special Deputy Collector, Kallar Reclamation, Madurai.

- 5. National Loan scholarship for the students who have obtained not less than 60 percent of marks in the qualifying examinations (Parental income limit Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum)
- Government of India scholarship to the children of political sufferers : Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai – 6 for the same.
- National scholarship for the children of school teachers; Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai – 6.
- Government of India Scholarship for blind, deaf or othopaedically handicapped students: Apply to the Speical Officer, Handicapped, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi – 1.
- Government of India Financial Assistance to the Children of Repatriates from Burma: Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai – 6.
- 10. Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Higher Education Assurance Scheme

The Government of TamilNadu has launched Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Higher Education Assurance Scheme to enhance the enrolment ratio of girls from Government schools to Higher Education Institutions. Through this scheme, the financial assistance of Rs. 1000/month will be provided to the girls till their completion of UG degree/Diploma/ITI/any other recognized course. The incentive amount under this scheme will be disbursed directly into the student's Bank Account.

NOTE:

- 1. The State government usually announces in May / June the details of various schemes and invites applications by issuing an advertisement in the leading newspapers of the State.
- 2. A scholarship holder cannot receive any other scholarship, financial assistance from Government or any other source, but she is entitled to fee concessions under 92 Madras Educational Rules.
- 3. When both the parents are not alive, Guardian's income can be given. Otherwise the sum total of the parent's income shall be given.
- 4. If a candidate is found, have obtained scholarship by making false statement, her/his scholarship will be cancelled forth and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered at the discretion of the Principal.
- 5. A scholarship may be cancelled if the scholar changes the subject of the course of study for which the scholarship was originally awarded or changes the institution of study without the prior approval of the Government.
- 6. The regulations of award can be changed at any time by the direction of the Government.
- 7. The Scholarships are liable to forfeiture for misconduct, irregularity, inattention, dissatisfactory progress in studies, Indiscipline etc.,

Various scholarships sanctioned by the collegiate Education, Chennai – 6.

I. National Merit Scholarship – Government of India scheme.

A fixed number of National Scholarships are sanctioned to the students belonging to Tamilnadu who are pursuing their studies (Degree and Post-Graduate Course). The selection of candidates is based on the 12th and UG results. The list of students is obtained based on the merit from the examination bodies. Students whose parents satisfy 'Means Test' are awarded scholarships every month and those who do not satisfy are paid a prize amount of Rs. 100/- and a merit Certificate, provided they are not in receipt of any other scholarships. Their annual income shall not exceed Rs. 50,000/-

II. Secondary Grade Teachers Children Scholarship:

This scholarship is given to the Children of secondary Grade Teachers working in Government Recognized Primary and Middle Schools for Pursuing M.A.,M.Sc.,M.Com.,M.Ed.,ML.,M.C.A.,M.Phil., courses in Taminadu. There is no income ceiling limit, but the students should have secured not less than 60% marks in the U.G. Courses. Selection is made on the Merit basis.

Amount of Scholarship

Day scholar - Rs. 120/- per month

Hosteller – Rs. 300/- per month

III. State Government Merit scholarship scheme:

Each student who secures the first place in X std, Matriculation, A.I.S.L.C., C.B.S.E. and A.I.S.S.C Examinations are awarded the scholarship irrespective of parental income.

IV. Freedom Fighters Scholarship

Students whose Parents have participated in the emancipation of India and have undergone three months imprisonment are eligible for the award of this scholarship scheme besides fee concessions for their studies in colleges and professional courses of studies.

V. Children of Defense Service Personnel

Children of defense service personnel and Ex-servicemen are awarded scholarships and fee concessions subject to certain terms and conditions.

VI. The Children of Repatriates from Sri Lanka

Children of Repatriates from Sri Lanka studying in colleges are awarded scholarships and fee concessions subject to certain terms and conditions.

VII. National Loan Scholarship

This is a merit – sum – means based scholarship. The Parental income shall not exceed Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum. Applications are invited every year by notifications in leading dailies.

VIII. State Collegiate Scholarships

Under this head, the following scholarships are being sanctioned.

- 1. General
- 2. Post Graduate
- 3. Special for Languages (Tamil and Telugu)
- 4. Special for Muslims
- 5. Special for Widows
- 6. Special for original Learning
- 7. Special Q.M.C.
- 8. Awards of Anglo Indian Scholarships.

Students who do not get any other scholarships and whose parental income is below Rs. 12000/- per annum can apply to any one of the eligible scholarship through their Principal. A sum of Rs. 270/- per annum will be sanctioned except S.No. 6 for which Rs. 135/- per annum will be sanctioned.

IX. Tamilnadu Agricultural Labourers Farmers Scheme 2006

This scholarship is given to the farmer's children studying UG & PG courses in Colleges in Tamilnadu. There is no income ceiling limit. But the students should not avail any other scholarship.

X. B.C., M.B.C., and S.C. Scholarships:

B.C., M.B.C. / D.N.C., and SC / ST scholarships are given to the eligible students stydying in Govt. Aided Arts and Science Colleges and Colleges of Education in Tamilnadu by the respective welfare departments through the college Principals.

XI. Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship Scheme for Single Girl Child

In order to achieve and promote girls education, UGC has introduced a Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for single child with an aim to compensate direct costs of girl education to all levels especially for such girls who happen to be the only girl child in their families.

The Value of Scholarship is Rs. 2,000/- p.m. for a period of two year only (10 months in the year) i.e. full duration of a PG course.

The student who is awarded Post-Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship will not be debarred from accepting any other scholarships.

STUDENTS AID FUND

- 1. The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to poor students to meet their tuition or examination fees or to purchase book.
- 2. The Managing Body of the Student's Aid Fund will consist of the following members.
 - i. The principal Ex. Office Chairman
 - ii. A Member of the Arts Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)
 - iii. A Member of the Language Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)
 - iv. A Member of the Science Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)
- 3. The Members of the managing Body except the Principal shall hold office for one academic Year.
- 4. There shall be a secretary for the Managing body to be nominated by the Chairman among the members referred above.
- 5. Application for the aid under this fund shall be made by the students to the Principal in the prescribed form which can be had from the College Office.

MAGAZINE

To bring out the talents of the students and to give them ample scope for creative expressions, the College has a magazine of its own. The Magazine is also a mirror of the activities of the College and its Associations. An Editorial board will be constituted by the Principal.

UGC REGULATION ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS - 2009

"Ragging is totally banned in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately.

RAGGING MEANS THE FOLLOWING:

Any Conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

PUNISHABLE OF RAGGING BEHAVIOURS:

- Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- > Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wrongful restraint;
- Wrongful confinement;
- Use of Criminal force;
- > Assault as well as sexual offences of unnatural offences; Extortion;
- Criminal trespass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal Intimidation ;

PUNISHMENTS AT THE INSTITUTION LEVEL:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- > Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- > Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / and other benefits
- > Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.,
- Suspension / expulsion from the College
- Cancellation of admission
- > Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- ▶ Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000/- and Rs. 1 lakh.
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Students are advised to desist from ragging and help to Create Ragging free campus.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. It shall be the duty of each student to attend the College regularly and punctually on all working days. No student shall absent herself/himself from the college without applying for leave.
- 2.A student who absents herself / himself shall submit an application in the prescribed form to their Class incharge. In case of sudden illness, the application shall be submitted in person to the Class incharge along with a medical certificate as early as possible. All leave applications with the remarks of the Class incharge shall then be submitted to the Principal for orders.

In each case the reasons for absence shall be specifically mentioned. The Principal reserves the right of calling for a Medical Certificate and of deciding each case on its merits. In cases not covered by the above, leave application shall be submitted as soon as possible after the leave is taken and in any case, before 3.45 p.m. on the first day of absence after the period of absence.

- 3.Granting of leave is entirely at the discretion of the Principal. Non- compliance with rules will entail automatic refusal of leave unless the student explains to the satisfaction of the Class incharge. Her / His Failure to comply with the rules, habitual non-compliance will entail imposition of fine or removal of the student's name from the roll of the College.
- 4.If a student is absent herself / himself for a continuous period of five working days without leave, her / his name will be off from the roll. Unless she / he convince satisfactorily that her / his failure to obtain leave was unavoidable.
- 5. The working day is divided into two sessions as forenoon and afternoon sessions. There will be three periods in the forenoon session and two periods in the afternoon.
- 6.Attendance will be taken at the beginning of every period. A student who is not in the class when the attendance is taken shall be marked absent and shall lose attendance for that session. It shall however be open to the teacher to mark a late comer present if he/she is satisfied with the student's explanation. A student who is absent without leave during any one or more periods of a session will be regarded as absent for the whole session.
- 7.The attendance certificate will not be granted unless (i) the Principal is satisfied that the student's progress and conduct are satisfactory and (ii) the student has attended three fourths of the number of working days in the academic year. Attendance certificates are liable to be held within the case of students who have not attended at least 75 percent of the working days.

9.No students shall be permitted to leave the class in the course of the hour. If he / she is needed urgently by the parent or guardian, he / she shall obtain permission from the office and only on receipt of intimation from the office, the student shall be permitted to leave the class.

GENERAL CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOUR

- 1. Every student shall wear a clean and decent dress.
- 2. Every student should wear ID card when they enter the college. Every student shall wish teachers of the college when they meet them for the first time during the day, within the college or outside.
- 3. When the teacher enters or leaves the class room, students shall get up and keep standing, till the teacher takes his/her seat or leaves the room.
- 4. Student shall leave the class room with permission or until the teacher leaves the room.
- 5. Students can spend their leisure class/time in the Library. They shall not loiter in the verandah or in the College campus and disturb the other classes.
- 6. Students shall not make any noise while moving from class to class.
- 7. Students are warned against displacing the furniture of the college. Any damage d o n e will be charged for.
- 8. Student can enter into the college office with permission.
- 9. Students are expected to read the notice on the college notice board. Ignorance of any notice will not be accepted as an excuse.
- 10.No notice of any kind shall be circulated among the students or displayed on the notice board without the written sanction of the Principal.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

- 1.Smoking inside the college premises, throwing out waste papers, defacing the walls and committing nuisance on the grounds are punishable offences.
- 2.No student shall take part in organizing any demonstration or strike.
- 3.Students on the rolls of college are forbidden to take an active part in political agitation directed against the authority of the government.
- 4.Principal or other constituted authorities of the College may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary nature. Regulation for the conduct of students on the roll is sought for (a) the observance of the above rules and (b) to maintain the reputation of the College.
- 5.Principal or other constituted authorities of the College shall have the power to impose the following punishments: Fine, with-holding attendance and/or course certificate, suspension or expulsion from the College, cancellation of scholarship and fee concessions.
- 6.Students are not allowed to address any authority in a body.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The general library now contains more than 26,000 books on various subjects. Dailies, magazines and periodicals of good order are available.

Our Library is an invaluable data centre for students and faculty members. It is well-equipped with the automation software "Campus I Lib". The Library has a collection of over 26,300 books on different subjects, 40 reputed National and International Journals, Magazines, News papers, e-resources and back volumes. It consists of recent books and Journals in the field of Arts, Science and Social Sciences etc., in addition to online resources.

The total area of the Library is 3, 328 sq ft. with the seating capacity of about 100 readers. The Library is completely computerized with barcode technology. Barcode laser scanners are used in the circulation counter for book transactions. The staff members and the students are provided with separate ID cards with barcode which ensures easy accessibility and issue of book procedure. Provides Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) service to its users. The library is fitted with CCTV cameras.It provides N-LIST under UGC-INFONET to access E-resources at free of cost.

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1.Library is a "Temple of Learning" hence complete silence, dignity and decorum should be maintained inside the library.
- 2.On all Working days the library will be kept open from 9.00a.m to 4.45pm.
- 3.Personal books and files should be left at the entrance of the library. Plain sheet should be taken instead.
- 4. Students/Staff should scan their ID card in the E-gate register scanner while entering.
- 5.Books will be issued only on the production of ID card.
- 6.No sub-lending of books is permitted.
- 7.Underlining, scribbling, tearing of pages or any other type of mutilation of books, magazines, journals, etc.., mishandling or misuse of computers will lead to severe action and fine.

8.Book Issue Procedure:

Teaching Staff	-10 books
Non-Teaching Staff	-5 books
UG Students	-2 books
PG Students	-3 books
Research Scholars	-5 books

9.Books will be issued normally for a period of fourteen days. If the book is not returned on the due day, a fine of one rupee per day will be collected.

- 10.Before leaving the counter, the member must check whether the book is in proper condition. If not, immediately report to the librarian. Otherwise he/she is responsible for the replacement of the book.
- 11. The reference books like Dictionaries, Encyclopedias, Very expensive books, Journals and Magazines are not issued, they can be referred inside the library.
- 12. Students are expected to use the books with care. If a book is lost or damaged the borrower should replace the books or pay the three times the cost of the book as penalty.

13. The Librarian may ask a student to return the library book at any time.

14. Transfer certificate and conduct certificate will not be issued to the students if they have not returned the library books.

15. Violation of the rules would lead to severe action.

Note: The above rules are intended to regulate the use of Library resources and will be reviewed periodically to meet the changing needs.

LABORATORY RULES

1.Act responsibly and maintain silence.

2. Always work under the supervision of the staff or lab assistant.

3.Follow all written and verbal instructions carefully.

4. Do not bring any eatables inside the lab.

5. Wear your safety equipments.

6.Know how to use and where to find all safety equipments including the first aid kit, eyewash station, safety shower, fire extinguisher, fire blankets, fire alarm and exits.

7.Dispose all waste properly.

8.No horseplay will be tolerated.

9.Keep a tidy lab.

10. Students will he held responsible for missing, damaging and misusing of any lab equipments.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS WORK

- 1. The course of study is based on semester pattern with Internal Assessment under choice based credit system.
- 2. The examinations consist of both the internal (CIA) and the external (end semester) theory exams. The theory examinations shall be conducted for three hours at the end of each semester.
- 3. The UG internal assessment will be done through two CIA and one model exam. Out of twenty five marks, it is split up as 5 marks for assignment, 5 marks for attendance and 15 marks for CIA/Model exams.
- 4.40 marks is the passmark in the semester with minimum of 30 marks out of 75 and 10 marks out of 25.
- 5. The PG internal assessment will be done through two CIA and one model exam. Out of twenty five marks, it is split up as 5 marks for assignment, 5 marks for attendance 5 marks for seminar and 10 marks for CIA/Model exams.
- 6.50 marks is the passmark in the semester with minimum of 38 marks out of 75 and 12 marks out of 25.
- 7. Students should attend all internal assessment exam and model exam. Two assignments and 75% of attendance are mandatory.
- 8. The students failing in any subject(s) will be permitted to appear for the same in the subsequent semester examinations.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR FORUMS / ACTIVITES

1.National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS wing has five units with the sanctioned strength of 500 functioning under the guidance of five programme offers. Any student either in the aided or unaided stream, who has penchant for social service may get enrolled in NSS. Besides regular activities, a seven days special camp focusing on tree plantation, creation of awareness regarding personal hygiene, AIDS, blood donation, Environmental protection etc. is organized every year. The wing pays attention to the all round development of the students.

2.National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The NCC Army wing with the sanctioned strength of 52 is under the command of a Commissioned Officer. Both boys and girls students who wish to improve their personality and leadership qualities and aspire to take up various positions in the army may get enrolled in NCC. The cadets may appear for 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations after fulfilling the requirements prescribed by the authorities.

3. Youth Red Cross (YRC)

This is yet another service organization with special focus on service to the society. Both Men and Women students may get enrolled in this forum. Training in Health Care, First Aid, Fire Fighting, Rescue Activities, personality Development are the salient features of YRC. It also lends helping hand in the housekeeping of the institution.

4.Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

The Red Ribbon Club in a voluntary on camp intervention program for students. The program organised by RRC address the knowledge, attitude and behaviour of the youths in the interrelated area of voluntary Blood Donation, HIV/AIDS, as demanded by their age, environment and life style.

Moto-"Embarking on the Journey of Life"

5. Physical Education (with Fitness Centre)

With the objective of improving the health and fitness of the youth, the fitness centre with many state-of-the art equipments is established for both men and women students. The Centre functions under the supervision of the Director of Physical Education. The students may avail the facilities between 4.00 p.m. and 5.30 p.m.

6.Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The cell provides Guidance and Counseling to the students regarding higher studies and conducts coaching, model tests, group discussions, mock interviews etc. it also arranges for campus interviews for placement in various organizations. Being housed in a separate room, the cell works between 9.00 a.m. and 10.00 a.m. and between 4.00 p.m. and 5.00 p.m.

7.FineArtsAssociation

This Association intends to create fervour and passion among the students in fine arts. The raw talents in music, painting, drawing, drama, dance etc., are being honed through this club.

8.Student's welfare and counselling centre

With the objective of taking care of both physical and mental health of the students, welfare and counselling centre has been constituted. To be housed in a separate room, the centre is to be manned by five staff members, out of whom two would be women. Students both boys and girls having grievances and emotional problems may feel free to meet the counselors and get counselling.

COLLEGE UNION AND ALLIED ASSOCIATIONS

1.All the students of the college and members of the staff shall be honorary members of the college union. The following Associations are affiliated to the Union.

- 7.Computer Science Association
- 8.Commerce Association
- 9.Games and Sports Association
- 10.Fine arts Association
- 2. The objectives of the union are as follows
 - a)To provide its members a ground for acquiring habit of effective speaking and skillful debates.

b)To further the common life of students which creates opportunities for social and cultural intercourse among its members.

c)To plan and execute such programmes as would afford adequate opportunities for the development of special talent and interests of its members.

d)To enable students to cultivate qualities of leadership and thereby prepare them for the service of the country.

- 3. The committee of the college union shall consist of:
 - a)Principal as President

b)Vice-President

c)Student-Chairman (to be elected by all the student members of the Union)

d)Secretary (to be elected by all the student members of the Union)

- 4.The Principal shall be the Ex-officio President of the College Union and other Associations affiliated to it and she shall be the final authority on all matters pertaining to the union and other Associations. The Vice-President of the Union and other Associations will be nominated by the Principal and the College Council Members.
- 5.Meetings shall be held only with the prior approval of the Principal and the respective Vice-President deputed by her for this purpose.
- 6.No expenditure shall be incurred except with the previous permission of the Principal.

- 7. The Election will be conducted by ballots if necessary and the office bearers should hold office for the academic year. In the event of an office bearer resigning her/his post, the President shall have the power to nominate a student member to carry on the functions of the office bearer.
- 8. The functions of the Union Cabinet shall be
- 1. To organize and conduct debates, study circles from time to time.
- 2. To organise extension lecture, popular exhibition and undertake such other cognate work as would be of educative value to its members and to society.
- 3. To afford opportunities for students to be trained as speakers, debaters and leaders.
- 4. To do such other things which might contribute to the social and cultural advancement of the community and enhance its reputation and dignity.
- 9. The Current funds of the Union shall be kept in such a manner as the Principal may direct.
- 10.No information or report about the Union or other associations shall be sent to the press or the broadcasting agencies without the permission and approval of the President.
- 11. For each Association, a student secretary will be elected by all the students of the college.
- 12. The college union and other associations are purely bodies to foster co- curricular activities of the students and will not have anything to do with the day administration of the College nor with party politics.
- 13. The rules that are framed for the college union are applicable to the associations which are affiliated to the College Union. Each association shall have its own Vice-president and Secretary but not a student chairman.

FEE CONCESSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- Students belonging to specified communities are eligible for the grant of Full or Half fee Concessions. The details of which can be known from the college office.
- The Concession will be granted wherever permissible. Applications for concessions shall be submitted before the 1st August of every year. Prescribed application forms can be had from the College office.
- Grant for scholarships from Government of India or State Government will be admissible to the students only when sanction orders are issued by the appropriate authorities. The college is not responsible for the grant or non-grants of Government Scholarships. All students are expected to pay their dues in the College in time.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSIONS

- 1.Half fee concession under rule 92 T.N.E.R for Degree Courses is given to backward Community students whose parental income does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/- per annum. They may apply to the Principal for the same.
- 2.Full fee concession under rule 92. T.N.E.R. is available to the students of scheduled Casts / Tribe. Most Backward classes and Denitrified Tribes may apply to the Principal for the same.
- 3. Concessions for the Children and dependent of service personnel of the Indian Army, air Force and Indian Navy are available.

4. Concessions for the children of political sufferers are also available. In addition to the above concession, the following scholarships are also available for both residential and non residential students.

1.Backward class / Most Backward class welfare scholarship and Adi-Dravidar Welfare scholarship.

BC, MBC, SC & ST students are eligible for the above scholarship.

The Income limit for BC/MBC : Rs. 2,00,000.

The Income limit for SC/ST : Rs. 2,50,000.

- 2.Kallar Reclamation scholarship is only for Primalaikallar students. They shall apply to the Special Deputy Collector, Kallar Reclamation, Madurai.
- 5.National Loan scholarship for the students who have obtained not less than 60 percent of marks in the qualifying examinations (Parental income limit Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum)
- 6.Government of India scholarship to the children of political sufferers : Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai 6 for the same.
- 7. National scholarship for the children of school teachers; Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai-6.
- 8.Government of India Scholarship for blind, deaf or othopaedically handicapped students: Apply to the Speical Officer, Handicapped, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi 1.
- 9.Government of India Financial Assistance to the Children of Repatriates from Burma: Apply to the Director of Collegiate Education, Chennai 6.
- 10. Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Higher Education Assurance Scheme
- The Government of TamilNadu has launched Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Higher Education Assurance Scheme to enhance the enrolment ratio of girls from Government schools to Higher Education Institutions. Through this scheme, the financial assistance of Rs. 1000/month will be provided to the girls till their completion of UG degree/Diploma/ITI/any other recognized course. The incentive amount under this scheme will be disbursed directly into the student's Bank Account.

NOTE:

- 1. The State government usually announces in May / June the details of various schemes and invites applications by issuing an advertisement in the leading newspapers of the State.
- 2.A scholarship holder cannot receive any other scholarship, financial assistance from Government or any other source, but she is entitled to fee concessions under 92 Madras Educational Rules.
- 3. When both the parents are not alive, Guardian's income can be given. Otherwise the sum total of the parent's income shall be given.
- 4.If a candidate is found, have obtained scholarship by making false statement, her/his scholarship will be cancelled forth and the amount of the scholarship paid will be recovered at the discretion of the Principal.
- 5.A scholarship may be cancelled if the scholar changes the subject of the course of study for which the scholarship was originally awarded or changes the institution of study without the prior

VIII.State Collegiate Scholarships

Under this head, the following scholarships are being sanctioned.

1.General

2.Post Graduate

3. Special for Languages (Tamil and Telugu)

4.Special for Muslims

5.Special for Widows

6.Special for original Learning

7.Special Q.M.C.

8.Awards of Anglo Indian Scholarships.

Students who do not get any other scholarships and whose parental income is below Rs. 12000/- per annum can apply to any one of the eligible scholarship through their Principal. A sum of Rs. 270/- per annum will be sanctioned except S.No. 6 for which Rs. 135/- per annum will be sanctioned.

IX. Tamilnadu Agricultural Labourers Farmers Scheme 2006

This scholarship is given to the farmer's children studying UG & PG courses in Colleges in Tamilnadu. There is no income ceiling limit. But the students should not avail any other scholarship.

X.B.C., M.B.C., and S.C. Scholarships:

B.C., M.B.C. / D.N.C., and SC / ST scholarships are given to the eligible students stydying in Govt. Aided Arts and Science Colleges and Colleges of Education in Tamilnadu by the respective welfare departments through the college Principals.

XI.Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship Scheme for Single Girl Child

In order to achieve and promote girls education, UGC has introduced a Post Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship for single child with an aim to compensate direct costs of girl education to all levels expecially for such girls who happen to be the only girl child in their families.

The Value of Scholarship is Rs. 2,000/- p.m. for a period of two year only (10 months in the year) i.e. full duration of a PG course.

The student who is awarded Post-Graduate Indira Gandhi Scholarship will not be debarred from accepting any other scholarships.

STUDENTS AID FUND

- 1. The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to poor students to meet their tuition or examination fees or to purchase book.
- 2. The Managing Body of the Student's Aid Fund will consist of the following members.

i. The principal Ex. Office Chairman

ii. A Member of the Arts Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)

iii. A Member of the Language Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)

iv. A Member of the Science Faculties (to be nominated by the Principal)

3. The Members of the managing Body except the Principal shall hold office for one academic Year.

- 4. There shall be a secretary for the Managing body to be nominated by the Chairman among the members referred above.
- 5. Application for the aid under this fund shall be made by the students to the Principal in the prescribed form which can be had from the College Office.

MAGAZINE

To bring out the talents of the students and to give them ample scope for creative expressions, the College has a magazine of its own. The Magazine is also a mirror of the activities of the College and its Associations. An Editorial board will be constituted by the Principal.

UGC REGULATION ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS - 2009

"Ragging is totally banned in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately.

RAGGING MEANS THE FOLLOWING:

Any Conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

PUNISHABLE OF RAGGING BEHAVIOURS:

- Abetment to ragging;
- Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging;
- · Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;
- Wrongful restraint;
- Wrongful confinement;
- Use of Criminal force;
- Assault as well as sexual offences of unnatural offences; Extortion;
- Criminal tresspass;
- Offences against property;
- Criminal Intimidation;

PUNISHMENTS AT THE INSTITUTION LEVEL:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.,
- Suspension / expulsion from the College
- Cancellation of admission
- Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000/- and Rs. 1 lakh.
- Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Students are advised to desist from ragging and help to Create Ragging free campus.
